



MATERIALS/CUTTING INFO: you will need to trim kit pieces to these sizes:




COLOR A	COLOR B	COLOR C	COLOR D
White tone on tone	Dark blue swirl	Medium light blue batik	White batik with blue leaves
One 7 1/4" square	One 2 5/8" by 6" strip	One 2 5/8" by 6" strip	Two 4 1/4"
Four 3 1/2" squares	One 4 1/2" by 9" rectangle	One 4 1/2" by 9" rectangle	squares

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS: Reminder: use scant 1/4" seams for accuracy!

Center unit:

1	FOUR PATCH UNIT: Sew the 6" COLOR B and COLOR C strips right sides together. Trim end and cut two 2 5/8" pieces. Lay out pieces as shown. Flip together and sew, matching seams and pushing seam allowance to darker fabric. Press. The four patch unit should measure 4 3/4" square.	
2	Cut the two COLOR D 4 1/4" squares in half diagonally to create a total of four triangles. Sew a triangle to opposite sides of four patch unit (hint: when flipped right sides together, center point of triangle should meet center seam of four patch). Press seam allowances away from four patch. Add triangles to remaining sides. Square unit to 6 1/2 inches, with center at 3 1/4".	

Outer Flying Geese Units:

1	Place the COLOR B and COLOR C 4 1/2" by 9" rectangles right sides together <u>with lighter color on top</u> . Draw a line at the 4 1/2" center mark, and draw diagonal lines as shown.	
2	Stitch a scant 1/4" on either side of both diagonal lines. Cut apart on drawn lines. Open up, press seams to darker fabric, and square each patch to 4". Cut each patch in half diagonally, crossing the seam. You will now have four two-color triangle units.	
3	Cut 7 1/4" background square across both diagonals. Sew pieced triangles from step 2 to background triangles as shown to create four flying geese units. (Be sure to follow color placement carefully, as half the COLOR B/C triangles have the dark COLOR B tips on the left, and half have the dark COLOR B tips on the right)	

Block Assembly:

Sew the 3 1/2" COLOR A squares to opposite sides of the two outer flying geese units.

Sew the remaining two flying geese units to opposite sides of the center unit.

Attach top and bottom rows to the center unit.

Block should be 12 1/2" square!!! Do not trim!
