Featured Quilter Carole Prévost-Meier

It didn't take much time for me to get hooked!

Between October and the spring meeting you just need to remind members at our meeting. You need to arrange for the turn-in meeting by having numbered tags if projects are being voted on, or by preparing in whatever way necessary for your project. For example, you might purchase a prize.

Community Outreach

Our March donations were 24 quilts, 5 quilt tops, 5 heart pillows to be filled, 39 pet beds, 8 pet beds to be filled, 25 pillowcases, 3 donations of quilt fabric, and 5 bags of fiberfill.

Thanks to your support of the Parkinson's Disease Foundation Quilt Project, the group is very close to the 16 blocks needed to make a Clinton County quilt. Four of our members volunteered to make quilt blocks with a support group member who doesn't quilt and four others signed up to make a donation to pay the registration and make a block. Judy Russell and Kate Del Signore will be at the May 12th meeting to pick up any finished quilt blocks or donated funds to register the quilt block.

We are drawing to the close of our year and I want to thank everyone who has donated to the Outreach Program for the amazing support. Ninety-six (96) individuals have donated so far this year. You have donated 157 quilts, 75 heart pillows, 202 pillowcases, and 204 pet beds plus fabric, batting, and fiberfill. A huge thank you to everyone for your generosity!

We have a few quilt kits to be quilted as well as heart pillow and two pillowcase patterns and the pillowcase forms. Please stop by the Outreach table to visit us.

I entered our 25 pillowcase donation in the One Million Pillowcase Challenge website. After ours were entered, there were a total of 69,742 pillowcases that have been donated. **Since the pillowcases may go to sick kids or the elderly, please wash and iron your completed pillowcases before you bring them in, even if you have washed the fabric. Also write "Washed" on the pillowcase form so I don't wash and iron it again.**

If you need fabric for a quilt top, batting and/or backing, stop by the Outreach table and let us know and I will bring it to the next meeting. You can also e-mail or call me with the information (scminnie@verizon.net, 562-1267).

We had a great time at the Sew-A-Thon. Thirteen people attended and we got lots of sewing done and did lots of visiting. We started with 30 kits and between the ones that people sewed at the Sew-A-Thon and those they took to finish at home, we only had 11 kits left at the end of the day. Thanks very much to everyone who attended and to Mary Lou Beauharnois, Connie Durocher, Sue Garrow, Jean Stow, Carolyn Tyndall, and Sandy Zmyewski for all of the cutting to make all of those kits possible.
